Beavers - Merry

This has been another successful year for Merry Colony. Lisa was assisted by Kate and Christopher, and supported by four young leaders, Madison, Luke C, Luck B and James. We had a regular number of 24 Beavers.

The Beavers have been working towards different Challenge badges and have taken part in a variety of activities such as survival den making, secret agent writing, making salt dough puppets and indoor team games. Outdoor activities have included cooking on fires, water slides and team obstacle course challenges.

13 Beavers were awarded their Chief Scout Bronze Award.

Along with the older sections of the group, 17 Beavers attended the Remembrance Day Parade in November 2015.

The Pirate themed Summer Sleepover in June was attended by 21 Beavers. This was a very enjoyable event and we were lucky to have beautiful weather. Activities included grass sledging, learning how to make fires, a delicious barbeque party and everyone enjoyed sleeping outside in Tepees. The Christmas Sleepover in December was attended by 18 Beavers and for many this was their first night away from home. We all had a fantastic time taking part in a variety of Christmas crafts, a visit from Santa and a delicious Christmas feast which was beautifully presented by our parent volunteer cook, John Hayes. We are very grateful to John for the time, energy and humour that he provided on that weekend.

The team ensured that all meetings and activities were interesting and fun, encouraging Beaver scouts to try many new challenges. Feedback from the Beaver scouts and their parents has been very positive.

Beavers - Pippin

Having only formed in October 2013, this report represents the first full 12 months for the colony.

The section was run by Dave & Spencer and assisted by Alison, with support from young leaders Sophie, Becky and Lizzie.

As well as the weekly meetings where the beavers played games and learnt such things as the Green Cross Code, Fair Trade and so on, they also attended a number of external events, some run by us and others by the district.

These included our first Summer Camp at Frylands Scout Centre in May with 16 Beaver Scouts attending. Activities included the assault course, underground tunnels, nature walks, pond dipping and the camp fire.
